Dear Homeowner,

In an effort to streamline the process of obtaining a street tree for your sidewalk, the Canton Garden Association has established a relationship with The City of Baltimore, Forestry Division.

If the public sidewalk around your property is found to be suitable for a street tree, one will be provided to you, free of charge, by the City of Baltimore, Forestry Division. Once you are approved for a free street tree, it should be planted during the next planting season for that particular species of tree.

(The City does not cover the cost nor perform the work.)

- If NO tree pit exists, grant funds may be available to assist the homeowner with the cost of cutting the sidewalk. Do you want an application?

Completing this request does not guarantee you will be approved for a street tree. Some locations are not suitable for trees due to sidewalk configuration, underground utilities, overhead obstruction, proximity to street signs, lamp posts etc. The Forestry Division makes final determinations of suitability and species. The CGA will notify you after the location is surveyed by the Forestry Supervisor; it may take 4-6 weeks. Trees are planted in the spring and fall each year.

Once planted, the trees should be watered by the homeowner, but remain property of the City of Baltimore in accordance with City Code, 1879, Article 47.
